## Tenure-track Professor in Organismic Biochemistry

Klaus Foerstemann, currently a postdoctoral fellow at the Massachussetts Medical School, has received the offer for a tenure-track position at the Gene Center. Klaus Foerstemann works on the molecular biology of gene regulatory microRNAs using Drosophila as a model organism.

### BioImaging Network (BIN) founded

Several LMU groups that use and develop bioimaging technologies have joined forces and founded the BioImaging Network Munich (BIN). BIN receives funding from the LMU-Innovative initiative and will strengthen research and teaching in the areas of structural biology, single-molecule imaging, advanced light microscopy, cell imaging, and intravital microscopy.

Hubert Kettenberger, a former PhD student at the Gene Center, has received this years GBM-Promotionspreis from the German association for Biochemistry and Molecular Biology.
